






Jour generosity and support gave David a new path of healing at Bethesda.



His family had quickly become deep in debt from putting the emergency room bills on various credit cards.

"My blood sugar numbers were in the 400s and 500s no matter what I ate or what I did," David said, recalling how the disease seemed not to respond to anything. "I was in so much debt and losing so much work. I was starting to lose my vision and function in my legs."

Desperate, David's wife mentioned Bethesda Health Clinic.

He was skeptical but agreed to take a chance.

David and his wife have three young daughters. He was motivated to try anything to be healthier for his family.

"I had gone to so many different doctors and they couldn't do anything about it," he said. "I knew it would cost me about \$1000 a month just to live."

David struggled to stay ahead and felt like there was no hope.

"Sometimes they would tell me I made too much money and then they would tell me I didn't make enough," he said, recalling his struggle to get any kind of financial help. "But at Bethesda, they told me, 'we help people in the middle."

"At Bethesda, everything changed, and they got me on an insulin program to get the medicine for free," David said. "It seems like everybody at Bethesda actually cared."

Your gifts gave David access to a medication program where his insulin is now completely free.

Bethesda staff work exclusively with pharmaceutical companies to get pricey, often unavailable, drugs to Bethesda patients at no cost.

After being a patient for just six months, David has never felt

better. He is able to go to work to take care of his family, and to look to the future without despair.

"I had never had blood sugar in the 100s unless I overshot myself with insulin, but now that's where it is," he said, overwhelmed with how much he has improved. "The lowest I would ever see was my blood sugar was 190 and I believed there was nothing I could do about it."

You gave David a happy ending to a real-life nightmare.

David tells everyone about Bethesda now and even said, "If I won the lottery I would give it to Bethesda."

Family, Service, Patriotism: The Gill Family

Gregory Gill was fresh out of CRNA school in 2012 when a friend asked him if he would be interested in volunteering at Bethesda.

Greg's skills were unique and desperately needed at the clinic. As a CRNA, or a certified registered nurse anesthetist, Greg is able to administer anesthesia for procedures and surgeries.

The addition of specialty services, including a monthly gastroenterology clinic, made Greg's role an amazing asset to the clinic.

"Initially, I needed a place to do my Army drill," Greg said. "I had no idea what the clinic offered at all. Once I started going there and seeing all the services, I realized there was a need."

Greg has now been a faithful volunteer, and the only CRNA, for many years.

"Over time I have done research...
and there's a lot of people out there
who just need medical attention, and
without the clinic, they wouldn't get
it," Greg said. "That's been very eye
opening to see. There is nothing more
rewarding than a patient hugging
you after a surgery and telling you
that without your help they wouldn't
have been able to get that done. It's a
blessing that I was led that way."

Greg is a former U.S. Marine and has spent 12 years in the Army Reserves. After leaving the Marine Corps, Greg was drawn to a career path to help people. Once he started the nursing program, he knew he was in the right place.

Greg continues to volunteer monthly during the Saturday GI clinic, where volunteer doctors perform colonoscopies and scopes at a huge discount, around \$100 for patients. This experience also counts to fulfill his service for the Army Reserves.

To make it a family affair, Greg's wife, Shawn, an LVN, and his daughter, a current nursing student at Tyler Junior College, are now coming monthly to volunteer.

"I have listened to Greg talk about how rewarding it is to serve, and I finally get the opportunity to do it," Shawn said.

Their daughter, Perry, is in the Registered Nurse program at TJC and will graduate next year.

She said, "I didn't even know that people needed help like this. It makes me happy to help people who work so hard but don't have insurance."

After growing up in an abusive home, he turned to drugs and alcohol after turning 18. Seeking what only God could ultimately provide, Marc spent decades in and out of jail, homeless and without hope.

Today, Marc is a new person, both on the inside and the outside.


Because of your support, Marc's smile matches the joy he feels on the inside.

"When I got here, all the doctors were really kind," Marc said, "When I was living on the streets, I stayed pretty much to myself. You always had to stay one step ahead of everybody, and I never trusted anybody. These people made me feel comfortable at Bethesda. They really gave me some hope as far as regaining that smile that I hadn't had in a long, long time due to my health and my drug addiction."

As Marc completed the steps at New Creation toward regaining his life back, his smile was transformed at Bethesda.



Marc hadn't been to the dentist in 40-something years. He needed extensive dental work and was amazed when he found out that was possible.

Marc's says, "Bethesda gave me hope because, you know, there's hope in the future. And that gave me confidence in myself. I realized, you know, I'm not such a bad guy, I just went through some bad times, and there are still some people out there who really are sincere about helping other people."
