





dream of owning a food truck, Cristian and Yesenia Mendoza were finally finding their rhythm — late nights, loyal customers, and a growing reputation for delicious tacos, burgers, and shrimp. Then, one night while closing, everything changed in a flash.

A bucket of 350-degree fryer oil slipped from its perch, cascading down Cristian's left leg. "It all happened so fast," recalls Yesenia. "I turned around, saw the bucket slipping, and screamed his name — but it was too late."

The burns were immediate and severe.

Cristian's left leg was almost entirely covered in second- and third-degree burns.

The skin was gone. The pain was unbearable. "He didn't have an inch of intact skin on that leg," says Bethesda nurse Dana. "He was in extreme pain when he came in — but he was determined to heal."

At first, Cristian was treated at a local emergency room where staff cleaned and dressed his wounds. But within days, Yesenia noticed signs of infection. "He was hurting so much more," she remembers. "We couldn't sleep. I was scared he was getting worse."

Yesenia reached out to a local wound care clinic, but was devastated when she was told they couldn't see him without insurance. Yesenia felt panic setting in — until a nurse mentioned Bethesda Health Clinic. "When I called, Andy answered the phone and said, 'Yes, come in. We'll get you taken care of.' She was an angel that day."

Cristian arrived at Bethesda barely able to walk. After a short admissions process, the medical team was able to see him that same day.



The wound-care team began gentle, meticulous debridement — a process of removing dead tissue so medication can reach healthy skin. "We scrubbed and treated the burns slowly," explains

Dana. "It's painful, but necessary to help new skin grow."

Yesenia quickly became her husband's at-home nurse, carefully following every instruction. "I'm not a nurse," she says with a smile, "but Bethesda taught me everything — how to clean, how to bandage, how to help him heal. They gave us supplies, antibiotics, and hope."

Between clinic visits, work worries, and caring for their four-year-old son, Cristian Jr., life was overwhelming. "There were days he couldn't even stand," says Yesenia. "My mom had to help get him in the car to come to the clinic."

But, because of your generosity, Cristian's wounds began to close. The bright red burns faded to pink — signs of new, healthy skin. "He's healing so well," Dana says proudly. "He's about 70% healed now. If he keeps going like this, he'll be back to work soon."

That's exactly what Cristian wants. "I'm so ready to get back to cooking," he says with a laugh. "I keep telling people — I burned myself, not the food!"

Without Bethesda, Cristian and Yesenia's story might have looked very different. Severe burns can lead to infection, disability, or worse when left untreated. "We have the tools and supplies to guide healing — and the compassion to walk families through it," says Dana. "God does the miracle, but we get to help."

Today, Cristian's healing is not just physical — it's a story of faith,

perseverance, and community. "We're so thankful," says Yesenia. "Bethesda helped us in every way — emotionally, financially, and spiritually. They gave us hope when we didn't know what to do."



Soon, Cristian and Yesenia will be back crafting delicious meals at Mendoza's Food Truck. You might see them around Tyler, and we hope you'll stop by, grab a taco, and say "Hello."

It is only with your help that healing moments like this are possible. You gave the Mendozas more than just wound care, but a way to heal. "Every visit, someone encouraged us," says Yesenia. "We felt cared for. We are so grateful."

Finding Hope Beyond Healthcare

Sometimes people come to Bethesda for help navigating life's hardest challenges. That was the case for Timothy Sparks and his wife, who had been living in a tent at Tyler State Park for over a year after losing their home in Alabama.

Timothy had lost his job because of health issues, and without steady income, they couldn't keep up with housing costs. At 70 years old, his wife was also struggling with her own health problems. They carried the heavy burden of uncertainty, unsure where to turn for stability.

When they walked through Bethesda's doors, they met our social worker, **Elizabeth Arrellano**, who took the time to truly listen to their story. She completed a full assessment of their needs and immediately connected them with resources: a disability specialist, lists of housing opportunities, and follow-up steps. Elizabeth also



made phone calls on their behalf, advocating for them to find stable housing.

One call made all the difference. A local apartment manager agreed to make an exception — moving the couple ahead on the waiting list because of their health concerns and homelessness.

Through Elizabeth, God provided a low-income senior apartment for the couple. For the first time in a long time, they will have a safe place to rest and heal. Timothy expressed his gratitude with heartfelt words:

"God got us here to meet
Bethesda. He lined up
everything so we could have
your help to grow and have a
better life. Pretty soon we will
have an apartment so we can
heal up, re-group medically and
financially, and start a new life.
Thank you, because you have
taken so much off our shoulders,
and you were truly a blessing."

His wife added:

"I have never seen a clinic with a counselor that helps like this. I am 70 years old, and I should have seen something like this before. This place is well organized, medically sound, and I got a social worker telling me how to do stuff. It's like being with family here—it's just wonderful."

At Bethesda, we know that healthcare is more than check-ups and prescriptions. Because of your help, we can provide dignity and hope, while walking alongside people as they find their way back to stability. Your support means the Sparks family now has the opportunity to rest, recover, and dream about their future again.

PATIENT STORY Miles of smiles: Beverly Faulks



When Beverly Faulks first walked through the doors of Bethesda Health Clinic, she was in a season of transition. "I had a stroke," she shared. "After that. I started seeking out dental care. That's how I found Bethesda through Christian Women's Job Corps."

Beverly had spent years putting her son's needs first. Her son, now 25, is autistic and a proud graduate of Texas A&M. "Thank God he's grown," Beverly said with a smile, "but now I have to put myself first."

Finding affordable, compassionate care was a turning point. "The cost was very reasonable," she explained. "I feel awesome now as a patient!"

Beverly admits she isn't sure what she would have done without Bethesda. "I'd be out there lost," she said. Instead. she has found a place where

professionalism meets kindness. "The dentists are very nice, very respectable, and professional. It's a friendly atmosphere. They give you the price upfront and let you know what steps you need to take. The dentist is awesome!"

She especially appreciated the way staff went the extra mile to meet her needs. "I'm dealing with partial dentures at the moment, and they even brought out samples for me to see that's awesome! No complaints!"

What touched Beverly most, though, was the joy she encountered at Bethesda. "You all are awesome people! It's early in the morning, and you're bubbly and friendly. I'm not a morning person, so I thank you for all y'all are doing!"

Today, Beverly volunteers with Christian Women's Job Corps, taking life one step at a time after her stroke. She lives in Tyler with her son and shares her story to encourage others. When asked if she would recommend Bethesda, her answer was immediate: "Yes! Because it's reasonable, they're nice and friendly, and it helps to come and speak with them to see what they can do for you."

For Beverly, Bethesda isn't just a clinic—it's a place of hope, healing, and genuine care.
